



Personal Assessment for Hepatitis C Risk



- 1 Have you ever had sex without a condom?
- 2 Have you ever shared a needle?
- 3 Have you ever shared spoons, pipes, cookers or other equipment for drug use?
- 4 Have you ever shared tattoo or body piercing equipment?
- 5 Have you ever received home or prison tattoos?
- 6 Have you ever shared or borrowed personal care items that may have blood on them such as razors, nail clippers, and toothbrushes.
- 7 Did you have a blood transfusion before 1992?





If you answered “YES” to one or more of the questions you should get tested for HIV, Hepatitis C and other sexually transmitted infections.

Hepatitis C Virus (HCV) injures the liver and can cause chronic liver disease.

Testing is the **only** way to find out if you have hepatitis C.

If you have hepatitis C, but don’t know it, you might pass the virus on to others. Hepatitis C is passed by blood to blood contact.

There is a **cure** for Hepatitis C. **Getting treated early could save your life.**
